- The information that accompanies a product or describes something in a science (whether computer science, physical science, or social science), trade, or profession

- Technical writers (not necessarily SMEs)

What is technical writing?

- Process of gathering information from experts and presenting it to an audience in a clear, easily understandable form

Who is technical writing for?

- Depends on the type of document
- Audience could be:
 - Users (hardware and software)
 - Employees (policies and procedures)
 - Sales personnel (product specifications)
 - Investors (financial and product information)
 - Others...
